





## How can I use InQuizitive to review my work and study for exams?

Click on your activity score at any time and you will be taken to a detailed activity report of your performance on an InQuizitive activity.



On your activity graph, green dots represent questions answered correctly and red dots represent questions answered incorrectly. You can click on the dots to review the questions.



On your learning objective report, you'll see a breakdown of how you're doing on each learning objective in the activity. Each learning objective's corresponding blue bar indicates how well you've performed. The longer the blue

bar, the better you performed in that specific learning objective.
