In Tutorials, students must answer all questions to receive a preliminary grade of 100%. This page details how students can progress through Tutorials activities to receive a grade.

How am I graded in Tutorials?

Tutorial activities are designed for low-stakes practice with particular skills. You will receive a completion grade of 100%, no matter how well you perform. To receive a grade for a Tutorial activity, you must answer all questions in the activity.

Keep in mind your instructor can review your performance and answers and may decide to alter your grade. You will see a note about your instructor's ability to adjust grades at the beginning and end of each tutorial activity.
